Professor Indika Gawarammana is the Consultant Physician at the Teaching Hospital, Peradeniya; Professor – Department of Medicine, Faculty of Medicine, University of Peradeniya and Senior Lecturer in Clinical Toxicology - Past Graduate Institute of Medicine, University of Colombo.

He received his Primary Education at Our Lady's Convent, Nuwara Eliya, later at St. Thomas' College, Guruthalawa and finally at Ananda College, Colombo. We are happy and proud that he was exposed to Catholic education and Christian values in the early stages of his long and distinguished career.

In the course of his career, he has held and continues to hold many eminent positions of great distinction that are beyond enumeration for they run into a couple of pages.

I am happy to mention some of his many achievements. At present, he is also the Director of Clinical Research – South Asian Clinical Toxicology Research; member of Research and Ethics Committee; Board Member – Asia Pacific Association; Member – Snake Bite Committee; Member – Pesticide Technical Advisory Committee.

Professor Indika Gawarammana has also reviewed the following journals – I) Journal of Clinical Toxicology, II) American Journal of Physicians, III) Critical Care Medicine, IV) Critical Reviews in Toxicology and V) Journal of Nephrology.

He is the recipient of 05 Grants with 42 research publications and 6 books to his credit.

He is Director of Research for the South Asian Clinical Toxicology Research Collaboration, an international collaboration of clinicians and researches studying the treatment of acute pesticide self-poisoning and working to reduce suicide and morbidity.

Granting bodies in the UK, Australia and Sri Lanka are among the benefactors towards research conducted by Professor Gawarammana and his team mates.

Numerous medical journals including "Journal of Clinical Toxicology", "American Journal of Physicians" and "Critical Care Medicine" count Professor among their reviewers.

He has received many awards for his work, including Presidential Awards and the Australian Leadership Award (Sri Lanka). In 2011, Professor Gawarammana presented the "Prof. K. Rajasooriya" Oration.

We are indeed honoured to have you with us Sir, your perseverance to realize your goals, your achievements and the service you render to this country and its people, will be an inspiration to our students.

We are also very happy to have Dr. Mrs. I. Gawarammana with us today. It is universally acknowledged that there is a woman behind a successful man. Undoubtedly, you have been his strength and support in all his endeavours, as you are also behind the success of your daughter, who attained the distinction of becoming the $1^{\rm st}$ in the island in the Arts Stream. We are happy to have you with us and welcome you warmly.

I am happy to present the report in the presence of this distinguished gathering. The purpose of holding a Prize Giving is not only to commend the students for their achievements, but also to re-assess the progress of the school in relation to its objectives. This year, I focus attention and concentrate on our school, teachers and our students. My purpose is to highlight the need of a school in modern times

The quality of education in schools is dependant on the performance of teachers and the role played by the principal in inspiring the teachers and getting their co-operation. The primary responsibility rests with the teacher who needs to comply with the school administration and reach out to students effectively. It is imperative that the Principal as the leader of the learning institution responds to the expectations and needs of the teacher, in order to provide quality education to students.

A positive and supportive relationship between the two groups will make it feasible for teachers to express themselves without fear of negative consequences. This will make teachers feel safe to make mistakes, ask for help and take risks and give them the assurance that there is respect for their role and that their triumphs and trials are validated. As a consequence there will be greater academic progress.

The working relationship in a school, needs to go beyond the surface level. It should be based on deep trust and respect. Respect includes a positive regard for individuals and their work. If there is mutual trust, there will be support and the teaching task will be easily accomplished.

It is also important that the Principal empowers teachers who can be positive leaders and these leaders must provide an environment that fosters respect and co-operation between the teachers and the administrators. In addition, the Principal should support teachers by providing opportunities for professional growth. The Principal should also empower teachers to get involved in decision making.

Relationships have many components, both individual and group which add value to a teaching environment. It is vital that inter-personal relationships between administrators and staff members be fostered through communication and supportive behaviour thus creating a positive working environment in the school. This would make the role of the principal easier, in setting directions, planning, organizing, motivating and balancing the tasks for the betterment of the school.

The responsibility of building trust among teachers is not the sole task of the principal, the support of the teachers is also vital. Relationships should be collegial and congenial. There can also be adverse relationships. When adverse relationships are rampant in a school, derogatory remarks, divisive trends, pulling in different directions and forming cliques will be evident, with dire consequences.

Congenial relationships are interactive and based on personal and friendly relations, providing moral support to one another and engaging in work, in a spirit of joy. This will enhance their ability to work effectively.

Collegial relationships are the hardest to establish. The famous baseball manager Casey Stengel once said, 'Getting players is easy. Getting them to play is the hardest part'. Collegial relationships among administrators and teachers can be established in a school, when all members share knowledge, observe one another, learn from their experiences and applaud the success of others.

A healthy working environment will create teacher satisfaction which is of prime importance for the efficiency that can be achieved in the school. A teacher who is not satisfied with work will perform poorly and have a negative impact on the students which in turn will affect the over-all efficiency of the school.

Job satisfaction is important as it contributes to organized learning and effective teaching. This is crucial, for, the students themselves are ultimately affected; their social, emotional, intellectual development and academic success in impaired. Teachers who do not enjoy the support of their colleagues will be less motivated to give their best in the classroom. Teachers who are happy and content with their job are not likely to change the institution where they work or change their profession.

We cannot under estimate the importance of the continual professional development of our teachers. This is especially so, in this era of increasing demands on teachers' expertise with higher expectations for their accomplishments. It is a challenge that teachers face, as there are at present, demands for more vigorous standards. In addition, the re-structuring of school, as well as the inclusion of more practical methods to accommodate an increasingly diverse student population, becomes necessary. These are realistic challenges for teachers, and to cope with this situation, an emotionally supportive environment, based on collegial instructions is imperative.

This is what we at Good Shepherd Convent strive to achieve, in our efforts to improve student performances in our school.

To put these thoughts in a nut-shell, the school can be compared to a mobile phone, with a cell within, which facilitates many possibilities – send out and receive messages, share, call, inform, direct, store, diffuse, endless considerations.

Think about it. There are many apps in a mobile cell, according to what is needed they can be put to maximum use. It works according to what our necessity is.

The school community can be thus compared to a cell in a mobile, where everyone can work harmoniously, effectively by fostering inter-persona' relationships, be connected to each other for the benefit of all.

It is also good to remember that each one has more potential than an app in a mobile cell, as we are humans and alive. So why not put ourselves together and work harmoniously for the betterment of our school.

There are viral apps too within a cell. They can drag and demolish all apps. This is a reminder to us, not to be destroyed by what is viral. It is up to us to keep the network strong and not be unworthy of our vocation of teaching. Together we can protect and build our educational institution, a place of renown, moving into the present century with more grace and knowledge.

All our activities and achievements in the school have been shaped by this vision. 



Special attention needs to be focused on teachers who work after school hours to help our children with extra-curricular activities and also help weak students so that they may achieve success. I am grateful to them.









The primary students had their academic and extra-curricular activities. Each event was celebrated with enthusiasm.





The students in the secondary section are from Grades 6 to 11. They are the most active group of students in extra-curricular activities. Yet the teachers ensure that they focus their attention on education.


The Grade 10 and 11 students were made to focus on their upcoming O/L examinations and were given assistance in their studies.




